Week 22 Monday	Story Introduction: Ben's Letter Song	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Narrate Ben's Letter Song as a sing-along story</li> <li>Introduce character Ben with puppet or cutout</li> <li>Emphasize rhythm and repetition in the song</li> <li>Children tap hands or clap with each line</li> <li>Show picture cards as each letter is sung</li> <li>Moral: Learning can be fun when we sing and help friends</li> </ul>	Puppet/Ben cutout, alphabet flashcards, speaker/music beat, visual aids for A-Z	Count and Match (31-40)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Show picture cards with 31-40 items (e.g., stars).</li> <li>Children count aloud and match to number cards.</li> <li>Match dots on flashcards to numeral cards.</li> <li>Use clip cards to attach clothespins to correct numbers.</li> <li>Count objects and stick them near number line.</li> <li>Practice saying "I matched 33 stars!"</li> </ul>	Flashcards, number cards, clothespins, sticker dots	Introduction to Animal Babies	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Show flashcards of animals and their young ones (e.g., Cow - Calf, Dog - Puppy).</li> <li>Conduct a picture talk to help children name and repeat animal baby names.</li> <li>Narrate a story "Mamma Duck and Her Ducklings" with voice modulation.</li> <li>Discuss how animal mothers take care of babies like humans.</li> <li>Sing a simple rhyme introducing animal babies.</li> <li>Ask children which animal baby they like.</li> </ul>	Flashcards of adult animals and young ones, storybook, pictures of animal families.	Story-Based Introduction to त्र and ज्ञ	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Introduce letters त्र &amp; ज्ञ with big wall chart</li> <li>Show stroke order using board demo</li> <li>Sand tray tracing for tactile learning</li> <li>Air writing with large arm movements</li> <li>Show real-life objects: त्रकिण, ज्ञान की कतिब</li> <li>Discuss meanings of new words</li> </ul>	Letter wall chart, sand trays, flashcards, real objects
Week 22 Tuesday	Alphabet Song & Gesture Play	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Sing the A-Z alphabet song with children</li> <li>Add gestures like clapping, hopping, or hand signs for each letter</li> <li>Identify familiar words per letter (A - apple, B - ball...)</li> <li>Children repeat after teacher with actions</li> <li>Use rhythm instruments like tambourine or claps</li> <li>Practice standing letter line - children hold letter placards</li> </ul>	Alphabet song audio, letter placards, gesture instructions, rhythm instruments	Number Line Walk (31-40)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Create a big floor number line (31-40).</li> <li>Call out numbers and ask kids to walk to it.</li> <li>Ask: "What comes before 34?"</li> <li>Children jump to the number before/after.</li> <li>Place small toy cars on numbers.</li> <li>Practice backward counting from 40-31.</li> </ul>	Floor tape/tiles, number flashcards, toy cars	Matching Animal Pairs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Review animal babies shown the previous day.</li> <li>Conduct a card-matching activity: adult baby (e.g., Horse Foal).</li> <li>Introduce a wall chart or poster showing animal families.</li> <li>Let children draw their favorite animal baby.</li> <li>Play "Guess the Baby" game with animal sounds.</li> <li>End with a quick quiz: "Who is the baby of a lion?"</li> </ul>	Matching cards, animal family poster, crayons, worksheets.	Phonetic Practice & Object Association	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Pronounce त्र &amp; ज्ञ slowly and clearly</li> <li>Echo technique: children repeat after teacher</li> <li>Show visual cards with matching words</li> <li>Play "Match picture to letter" game</li> <li>Revise pronunciation with clapping rhythm</li> <li>Identify त्र &amp; ज्ञ in a letter chart</li> </ul>	Flashcards, picture cards, mixed letter chart
Week 22 Wednesday	Letter Hunt Game + Sequence Practice	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Hide alphabet cards around the classroom</li> <li>Children search and collect them like Ben in the story</li> <li>Work in groups to arrange A-Z in order</li> <li>Practice phonic sound of each found letter</li> <li>Discuss which letters were tricky and why</li> <li>Celebrate completing the alphabet train</li> </ul>	Hidden A-Z cards, floor space for arrangement, reward stars/stickers, sound charts	Real Object Grouping & Matching	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Distribute crayons/beads to groups of 31-40.</li> <li>Children count and place near matching number.</li> <li>Use stickers to label baskets with numbers.</li> <li>Pair children - one counts, one matches.</li> <li>Make towers of 36-40 Legos.</li> <li>Say numbers aloud as they build.</li> </ul>	Crayons, beads, Lego blocks, number labels	Animal Baby Song & Movements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Start the day with the rhyme "A baby cat is called a kitten..."</li> <li>Use soft animal toys or puppets during rhyme time.</li> <li>Engage children in role play: move like puppies, kittens, lambs.</li> <li>Reinforce names by pointing to toys/flashcards.</li> <li>Ask children to say the animal baby names aloud.</li> <li>Use a puppet show to recap key learning.</li> </ul>	Toy animals, animal baby song lyrics, puppets.	Writing Practice & Worksheet Work	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Blackboard tracing of त्र &amp; ज्ञ</li> <li>Individual worksheet tracing</li> <li>Word writing: त्रकिण, ज्ञानी</li> <li>Drawing activity: triangle &amp; book of knowledge</li> <li>Pair activity: exchange worksheets to check</li> <li>Color the pictures linked to the letters</li> </ul>	Blackboard, chalk, worksheets, crayons
