Week 23 Monday	Letter Introduction – Pp	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Introduce letter Pp with sound /p/ Match real-life items with Pp sound (pen, pig, pot, paper) Phonics chant: "P says /p/, like pig and pen" Air-trace Pp in the air and on back of partner Show Pp flashcards and images Say Hindi equivalent: प 	Pp flashcards, real Pp objects, sound chart, phonics chant cards	Missing Numbers (1-20)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Display a number line with missing numbers. Count aloud from 1-20 with class. Point and ask "What number is missing?" Use flashcards to fill in the gaps. Children take turns placing the correct number. Clap on missing numbers together. 	Number line chart, flashcards, markers	Storytime: Three Little Kittens	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Narrate "Three Little Kittens" using puppet props and dramatic expressions. Introduce kitten puppets and let children touch and play. Ask questions like "Why were the kittens sad?" Talk about feelings: happy, sad, sorry. Use visuals of mittens and kittens. Sing rhyme together slowly. 	Kitten puppets, flashcards, rhyme chart	Letter Tracing Practice – श, ष, स, ह	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Introduce letters with big flashcards Demonstrate air tracing for each letter Children trace letters in sand trays Workbook/dotted line tracing for all 4 letters Recite related words while tracing (e.g., श से शेर) Quick oral drill: "Say one word for each letter" 	Large letter flashcards, sand trays, workbooks, crayons
Week 23 Tuesday	Letter Tracing Practice	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Finger trace Pp in sand/salt tray Practice writing Pp in worksheet (Pp-Tt) Emphasize letter stroke order and direction Revise /p/ sound with picture cards Match Pp with object: pig – pen – pizza – pencil Practice saying "P says /p/" aloud 	Sand tray, Alphabet Pp-Tt worksheet, pencils, erasers, phonics cards	Number Puzzles	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provide jigsaw puzzles with numbers 1-20. Ask children to arrange pieces in sequence. Play "Find your neighbor" (each child has a number). Build a puzzle train on the floor. Solve puzzles in pairs. Display completed puzzles on the wall. 	Number jigsaw puzzles, floor space	Acting Out the Rhyme	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Children wear kitten masks. Enact the rhyme: losing, finding, and washing mittens. Discuss the concept of being responsible. Use repetition to build memory. Explore kitten actions: meow, purr, jump. Let each child act a part of the rhyme. 	Kitten masks, mitten cutouts, role-play area	Flashcard Matching Game	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Show picture cards: हाथी, शेर, षट्कोण, साइकल Ask children to identify starting letter Match each card to correct letter board Repeat letter sound after matching Play "Guess the letter" – show half of the picture Encourage full sentence responses: "ये शेर है, श से शेर" 	Picture flashcards, letter boards, matching chart
Week 23 Wednesday	Story Recap Circle	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Retell Ellie the Elephant, I Had a Little Turtle, and Mummy's Kitchen Garden Children recall key moments and moral of each story Role-play key characters: Ellie, Turtle, Mummy Group discussion: What do we learn from each? Link letters E, T, M, and P Identify character names beginning with those letters 	Storybooks or visuals, masks/toys for role-play, chart for morals and characters	Fill-in-the-Blanks + Dot-to-Dot	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Write patterns on the board (e.g., 8, __, 10). Invite children to come up and fill in blanks. Distribute dot-to-dot worksheets (1-20). Guide them to connect dots in order. Complete and color the picture. Count aloud during dot connections. 	Whiteboard, dot-to-dot worksheets, chalks/crayons	Picture Talk & Animal Sounds	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Show large pictures of kittens, mittens, and the mother cat. Discuss the picture: What do you see? What are they doing? Play animal sounds: meow, bark, moo, etc. Identify and mimic kitten sounds. Name other baby animals. Encourage two-word sentences. 	Picture cards, speaker for animal sounds	Letter Sorting & Group Activity	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Mix up word/picture flashcards Children sort them into 4 baskets labelled , ष, स, ह Pronounce each word as you sort Play a relay game: pick and place in correct basket Revise with quick "point to the basket" quiz End with group chanting of letters with actions 	Baskets with labels, flashcards, labels, action rhyme
