Week 3 Monday	Introduction to Curved Shapes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Visual Aids: Show real-life curved items (banana, bowl, rainbow) Observation & Inquiry: "Find curved objects around you" Storytelling: Use a picture book featuring curves and spirals Kinesthetic Learning: Walk on spiral and circle taped paths Sensory Exploration: Trace curves in sand tray Worksheet: Trace curves 	Curved object flashcards, storybook, floor tape, sand tray, worksheet printouts	Introduction to Rectangle	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Show real objects: book, door, mobile, table. Count rectangle sides and corners together. Use flashcards to differentiate rectangle from square. Finger trace rectangle shape in sand tray. Chant: "A rectangle has four sides – two long, two short!" Free drawing: draw and color a rectangle item (TV/book). 	Rectangle flashcards, sand tray, real-life rectangle items, worksheet	Poem – "My Red Balloon"	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Recite the poem "My Red Balloon" using gestures and actions to engage the children. Emphasize the word "red" each time it appears in the poem. Show a real red balloon and pass it around during the rhyme. Ask children: "What colour is this balloon?" Repeat the rhyme once with musical background. Encourage children to repeat lines with the teacher. 	Red balloon, poem audio or print, speaker, flashcards, soft mat or carpet	Story-Based Introduction of इ, ई	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Introduce letters इ, ई through story "दयालु शलिपा" Show flashcards with words like इमली, ईख, ईट Discuss: "Which words from the story start with इ or ई?" Air tracing of both letters with sound pronunciation Let children trace letters in sand trays Teach a simple rhyme with इ, ई sounds 	Story cards, letter flashcards, sand tray, rhyme chart
Week 3 Tuesday	The Letter Aa (Aa + Curves)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Visual-Motor Coordination: Finger trace capital & small Aa in sand Interactive Whiteboard: Display how 'Aa' is made using curves and straight lines Matching Game: Aa to apple, ant, etc. Play-Based Learning: Letter Aa puzzle matching Craft: Make the letter Aa with playdough Worksheet: Circle objects that begin with Aa 	Sand tray, whiteboard, letter puzzle, playdough, flashcards (Aa words), Aa worksheet	Introduction to Triangle	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Show triangle objects: sandwich, hanger, mountain sign. Count 3 sides and 3 corners aloud. Trace triangles using yarn and chalk outline. Triangle dance: form triangle shape with arms. Story time: "Tina's Triangle Party Hat" with triangle decor. Triangle tracing with crayons on worksheet. 	Triangle cutouts, chalk, yarn, party hat picture, worksheet	Red Colour Identification	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Begin with a quick poem recap using hand actions and body movement. Show flashcards of red objects (apple, tomato, rose, balloon). Let children touch and name the red items shown on the cards. Play a simple "Guess the Red Item" game. Encourage the sentence: "This is red." End with a short rhyme with red object cards. 	Red object flashcards, apple, tomato, rose toys or cut-outs, visual cards	Letter Recognition & Sound Activity – इ	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Show large chart with इ words: इमली, इजन, इतर Play "Find the Letter" on a mixed-letter chart Air tracing followed by finger tracing on floor/sand Matching game: picture to letter इ Introduce a short chant using इ words Practice tracing on dotted worksheets 	Letter chart, picture flashcards, worksheets
Week 2 Wednesday	Exploring Colours	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Poem Time: Recite Colours poem with props and colorful visuals Sorting Activity: Sort colored pom-poms into matching bowls Picture-Based Discussion: "What color is the sky? Your shirt?" Role Play: Act as color detectives finding objects by color Game-Based Learning: "Find the Red!" scavenger hunt Story Link: Colors in the book 	Colour poem chart, pom-poms, color bowls, colored object cards, detective hats, story visuals	Shape Comparison	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Flashcard sort: rectangle vs. triangle vs. square. Draw shapes on board and count aloud. Match shapes to everyday items on poster. Group activity: match outlines with shapes. Shape song: "Triangle has three sides..." Clay activity: form both shapes with fingers. 	Flashcards, matching board, play dough/clay, posters	Red Colour Hunt	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Organize a classroom "Red Colour Hunt" where students find red items. Place red crayons, apples, and red toys around the classroom. Children call out "I found red!" when they spot something. Introduce red colour sorting—red items in a red box. Each child shows their found object and names it. Reinforce: "Red balloon", "Red apple", etc. 	Red objects (crayons, toys), sorting boxes, labels, red props	Letter Recognition & Sound Activity – ई	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Show large chart with ई words: ईट, ईख, ईमान Play "Find the Letter" with focus on ई Matching game: picture to letter ई Tracing practice on slates or paper Rhyme/chant using ई words Draw and color an object starting with ई 	Letter chart, flashcards, slates, crayons
