Week 31 Monday	Introduction to Letters Xx & Yy	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Introduce sound and shape of Xx (e.g., box, fox, x-ray)</li> <li>Introduce sound and shape of Yy (e.g., yellow, yogurt, yo-yo)</li> <li>Flashcards and real object discussion</li> <li>Play phonics songs: "X says /ks/", "Y says /y/"</li> <li>Air trace and finger trace both letters in sand/flour</li> <li>Say the Hindi equivalents: X – "क़", Y – "य़"</li> </ul>	Flashcards, sand tray, objects like yo-yo, box, yogurt cup	Wide vs. Narrow (Object Demo)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Show pairs of objects (e.g., trays, ribbons, books).</li> <li>Ask: "Which is wide? Which is narrow?"</li> <li>Let children handle and compare.</li> <li>Play "Find something wide" in class.</li> <li>Repeat with visuals and real-life objects.</li> </ul>	Ribbons, trays, boxes, books, flashcards	Introduction to Land & Air Transport	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Begin with a visual introduction using flashcards/videos of cars, buses, trains, airplanes, and helicopters.</li> <li>Ask children to name and describe the vehicles.</li> <li>Point out differences between land and air transport.</li> <li>Use toy vehicles to enhance recognition.</li> <li>Encourage children to share if they've travelled in any of these vehicles.</li> <li>End with a fun song: "Wheels on the Bus".</li> </ul>	Flashcards, toy vehicles, videos, chart paper	Varnamala Recap with Flashcards	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Display flashcards for each letter (अ-ज़)</li> <li>Revise pronunciation &amp; 2-3 word examples for each letter</li> <li>Sing an "A to ज़" rhyme with actions</li> <li>Quick oral quiz: teacher says a letter, students give a word</li> <li>Match letters with related picture cards</li> <li>End with clapping chant of the full Varnamala</li> </ul>	Flashcards (अ-ज़), picture cards, kavita chart
Week 31 Tuesday	Poem: This Is the Way We Cross the Road	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Introduce poem with movement actions: look left-right, walk straight</li> <li>Use classroom visuals: zebra crossing, traffic lights, stop signs</li> <li>Sing with gestures and practice reciting in small groups</li> <li>Discuss: "Why do we follow traffic rules?"</li> <li>Reinforce key words: road, signal, stop, go, left, right</li> <li>Children share road-crossing experiences with family</li> </ul>	Toy traffic lights, cones, zebra crossing cutouts, road signs	Full vs. Empty (Water Play)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Set up water station with jugs and cups.</li> <li>Ask children to fill and empty cups.</li> <li>Use language: "This is full," "Now it's empty."</li> <li>Play "Can you fill it to the top?"</li> <li>Discuss and compare containers.</li> </ul>	Jugs, cups, bottles, transparent containers	Storytime – Grandma's Visit	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Narrate a story of a child who visits grandma's house by car and returns by airplane.</li> <li>Show flashcards of each vehicle mentioned.</li> <li>Pause and ask: "Which vehicle is this?", "Where does it move?"</li> <li>Discuss how land and air transport help us travel.</li> <li>Let children act out the journey.</li> <li>Reinforce with questions after story.</li> </ul>	Storybook or teacher-created visuals, flashcards, picture cards	Story & Poem Reading with Letter Focus	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Read a short Hindi poem or story aloud</li> <li>Highlight and circle letters as you read</li> <li>Ask children to spot letters in the text</li> <li>Group game: "Find the missing letter" from story words</li> <li>Pair work: children underline chosen letters</li> <li>Recall game: each child says one letter + related word</li> </ul>	Storybook, kavita chart, printed text with letters
Week 31 Wednesday	'X' Marks the Spot Game	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Hide small toys or letter cards around the room</li> <li>Children use paper maps with "X" to find them</li> <li>Emphasize letter Xx and the phrase "X marks the spot"</li> <li>Recap story or object names using /x/ sound</li> <li>Practice writing Xx on worksheet after the game</li> <li>Reinforce word endings like -box, -fox, -mix</li> </ul>	Paper maps, small objects, worksheet, pencils	Bella's Story Adventure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Narrate story of Bella and Ben's garden play.</li> <li>Emphasize how they filled watering cans and packed wide/narrow baskets.</li> <li>Use cut-outs to retell and identify objects.</li> <li>Ask follow-up questions from the story.</li> <li>Recap through group discussion.</li> </ul>	Story visuals, puppet or story props, basket cut-outs	Transport Sorting Activity	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Introduce a sorting activity using vehicle cutouts.</li> <li>Children categorize them under "Land" or "Air".</li> <li>Use large floor visuals or mats for sorting.</li> <li>Reinforce learning with chants: "Car on road, Plane in sky!"</li> <li>Talk about vehicle sounds.</li> <li>Wrap up with rhyme: "Zoom zoom zoom..."</li> </ul>	Cutouts of vehicles, mats/chart for sorting, glue	Letter Hunt Game – "Akshar Khojo" (External)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Hide laminated letter cards (अ-ज़) around classroom/outdoor area</li> <li>Children search for a letter &amp; say it aloud</li> <li>Say a word starting with that letter</li> <li>Stick found letters on an "Akshar Tree" chart</li> <li>Repeat until all letters are found</li> <li>Discuss letters and words at the end</li> </ul>	Laminated letter cards, basket, Akshar Tree poster/chart
