Week 32 Monday	Letter Zz Recognition	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Introduce Zz with flashcards and toys (zebra, zipper)</li> <li>Practice air writing and sand tracing</li> <li>Play phonic chant: "Z says /z/ like zip and zebra"</li> <li>Use pictures to find Zz words</li> <li>Circle Zz from a mixed letter group</li> <li>Hindi equivalent: ज़ / झ</li> </ul>	Zebra toy, zip, sand tray, letter flashcards	Equal Sets + More and Less	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Show sets of blocks/crayons and compare counts.</li> <li>Ask: "Are these equal?" "Which set has more?"</li> <li>Children count aloud and sort into 'more' or 'less'.</li> <li>Play "Guess Which Has More" using two covered bowls.</li> <li>Match equal sets using flashcards.</li> <li>Colour the sets with equal objects.</li> </ul>	Bowls, crayons, blocks, equal set cards, comparison chart	Introduction to Water Transport	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Show flashcards of water transport (boat, ship, submarine) and ask children to name them.</li> <li>Use toy models or pictures to let children identify and describe them.</li> <li>Narrate a story about Ben sailing on a boat to an island.</li> <li>Play sound clips of water vehicles and ask children to guess.</li> <li>Sing "Row Row Row Your Boat" with hand actions.</li> <li>Let children draw their favorite water vehicle.</li> </ul>	Flashcards of water vehicles, toy boats/ships, water sounds, storybook, drawing sheet and crayons	Revision Circle Time – अ-ज़	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Warm-up – Sing an alphabet song from अ-ज़ to refresh memory</li> <li>Circle Setup – Arrange children in a big circle on the floor</li> <li>Quick Question Round – Ask each child a random letter question ("What starts with क?") "Which letter comes after त?")</li> <li>Peer Support – If a child struggles, allow a peer to help so it remains positive</li> <li>Clap &amp; Cheer Rule – Class claps for every correct answer</li> <li>End Recap – Teacher reviews all letters, highlighting tricky ones</li> </ul>	अ-ज़ flashcards, floor mats, alphabet song audio
Week 32 Tuesday	Story: Going to the Zoo	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Narrate "Going to the Zoo" with animal sounds</li> <li>Use puppets or animal toys/flashcards</li> <li>Ask: "Which animals live in the zoo?"</li> <li>Count zoo animals together</li> <li>Discuss animal actions and sounds</li> <li>Let children share if they've visited a zoo</li> </ul>	Zoo flashcards, animal puppets, counting cards	One More	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Use toy animals to show groups of 3, then add one more.</li> <li>Ask: "Now how many?"</li> <li>Play "One More Hop" – jump one more than called number.</li> <li>Flashcard matching – "Show one more than 6."</li> <li>Use counters to build sets of increasing quantity.</li> <li>Draw "one more" object on worksheet.</li> </ul>	Flashcards, counters, toys, worksheets, hop mat	Traffic Light Introduction	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Use red, yellow, and green flashcards to introduce traffic light colors.</li> <li>Talk about what each color means (Stop, Wait, Go).</li> <li>Let children act: Stop when red is shown, walk when green is shown.</li> <li>Sing "Red light, red light, what do you say?" with actions.</li> <li>Match the light colors to action cards.</li> <li>Let children color a traffic signal worksheet.</li> </ul>	Red, yellow, green circles, song lyrics, action cards, traffic light coloring worksheet	Interactive Rhyme Recall	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Introduction – Tell children they will play the "Pause &amp; Play" rhyme game</li> <li>Play a Rhyme – Start the rhyme music and pause suddenly</li> <li>Complete the Line – The group must sing the next line together</li> <li>Small Groups – Divide into 4-5 children for focused turns</li> <li>Add Actions – Encourage children to act while saying the lines</li> <li>Friendly Competition – Each group earns stars for completing lines correctly</li> </ul>	Music player, rhyme playlist, star stickers
Week 32 Wednesday	Poem Recap + Letter Tracing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Recite Aeroplane with flying actions</li> <li>Recite This Is the Way We Cross the Road with traffic signs</li> <li>Reinforce road safety: look left, right, walk</li> <li>Children act out both poems</li> <li>Practice Zz tracing on dotted-line worksheets</li> <li>Use real objects starting with Zz</li> </ul>	Worksheets, toy planes, road sign cards	Ordinal Numbers (1st-5th)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Use a toy race setup with animals or vehicles.</li> <li>Tell a story using positions: "The rabbit is 1st, turtle is 3rd..."</li> <li>Label children standing in a line with 1st-5th tags.</li> <li>Sing ordinal number song.</li> <li>Colour positions: "Colour the 2nd balloon red."</li> <li>Arrange ordinal cards in order.</li> </ul>	Toy animals, number tags, ordinal flashcards, story cutouts	Water Transport Craft – Boat Making	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Fold paper boats with the children and color them.</li> <li>Let children float boats in a tub of water (with supervision).</li> <li>Count how many boats are made.</li> <li>Identify which ones float or sink.</li> <li>Talk about how boats help us during floods or travel.</li> <li>Children name their boats and say where they're going (pretend play).</li> </ul>	Paper for folding, crayons, tub of water, safe floating/sinking items	Picture Prompt Writing & Flashcard Race	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Picture Talk – Show a clear image (फल, पक्षी, जानवर) and have children name it aloud</li> <li>Writing Practice – Ask them to write the full word or its starting letter on worksheets</li> <li>Flashcard Race – Teacher calls out a word, children run to pick the correct letter card from the floor</li> <li>Rotation Rule – Ensure every child gets multiple turns</li> <li>Correct &amp; Praise – Show correct answers immediately and praise efforts</li> <li>Short Recap – Review all words used in the game</li> </ul>	Picture flashcards, writing worksheets, pencils, Hindi letter cards
