Week 8 Monday	Storytelling & Role-Play	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Storytelling: Narrate Five Friends and Their Adventures using expressive voice and gestures • Picture Talk: Show illustrations – ask “Who are the friends?” “Where are they going?” • Role Play: Assign roles and let children act out scenes • Interactive Q&A: Ask “What did the friends learn?” • Recap letter Aa–Ee sounds & chant 	Story visuals, printed characters, role badges or props, letter flashcards	Before, After, and Between – Introduction	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lay out floor number line 1–10 using flashcards or tape. • Ask: “What comes before 3?” or “What comes after 6?” • Children jump to the correct number on the floor line. • Reinforce with counting aloud and finger tracing. • Review numbers 1–10 with number song. • Children draw numbers on the board. 	Number flashcards, floor tape, marker, chart paper	Touch and Name: Exploring Body Parts	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Begin with “Name and Touch” game (e.g., touch your head). • Use body part flashcards and ask children to match them. • Introduce “Head, Shoulders, Knees, and Toes” song. • Ask children to look in a mirror and point to their facial features. • Show body part positions on a doll/toy and repeat on self. • Recap by asking each child to name one body part they learned. 	Flashcards, mirror, dolls or soft toys, speaker/music, chart with body parts	Letter Sound & Introduction – क	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Introduce letter क with correct pronunciation • Show flashcards with words: कबूतर, कमल, केला, कतिब • Air trace ‘क’ together as a class • Finger tracing in sand tray • Identify ‘क’ words from a picture chart • Short phonic rhyme for ‘क’ 	Flashcards, sand tray, picture chart, rhyme audio
Week 8 Tuesday	Value Discussion + Drawing Activity	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Value Talk: Discuss the importance of friendship, kindness, and teamwork • Activity 1 – Friendship Chain: Each child draws their 5 friends and makes a paper chain linking them • Show & Tell: Children introduce their drawings and name their friends • Air Tracing: Aa–Ee recap 	Drawing sheets, crayons, strips of paper, glue/tape, letter recap cards	Flashcard Game – Before/After	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Show random flashcards (1–10) and ask: “What’s after this?” • Let children guess and show on their fingers. • Use number tiles to place before/after cards. • Engage class in a choral response activity. • Match numbers on board with correct positions. • Sing a number rhyme reinforcing order. 	Number flashcards, tiles, board, pointer stick	I See, I Hear, I Feel: Sense Organs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Discuss body parts related to senses (eyes, ears, hands). • Sensory play: touch cotton, sponge and describe feel. • Match body parts to senses (e.g., eyes – see). • Use a puppet to ask “What do you use to listen?” etc. • Play “Guess the Sound” – play a bell or clap behind curtain. • Sing a rhyme about senses (e.g., “With My Eyes, I See”). 	Cotton, sponge, audio clips or bell, flashcards of sense organs, puppet	Letter Sound & Introduction – ख	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Introduce letter ख with correct pronunciation • Show flashcards with words: खटगोश, खटमल, खीरा, खड़की • Air trace ‘ख’ together • Finger tracing in sand tray • Play “Find objects starting with ख” in class • Short phonic rhyme for ‘ख’ 	Flashcards, sand tray, classroom object set
Week 8 Wednesday	Create Your Own Adventure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Activity 2 – Draw & Share: Each child draws an imaginary adventure with their friends (picnic, jungle trip, treasure hunt, etc.) • Presentation: Children explain their drawing in a few words • Moral Recap: “Friends help and play together” • Picture Sorting: Match items from the story (bag, map, etc.) to adventure scenes 	Drawing paper, story flashcards, coloured pencils, visual aids	Object Sequencing & Group Game	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Distribute number-labeled caps/toys to children. • Ask children to stand in number order (1–10). • Teacher asks: “Who’s standing after 4?” etc. • Repeat with shuffled order to reinforce logic. • Introduce sand tray tracing of numbers. • Group discussion using soft ball to say “before/after” number. 	Number caps, bottle caps/toys, soft ball, sand tray	Let’s Make a Body Puzzle!	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Distribute body part puzzle pieces to children. • Guide them to place each part in correct order. • Ask: “Where does this go?” for reasoning. • Reinforce names by pointing and repeating together. • Tell a story about “Ben the Body” who lost his nose, etc. • Recap with body part pointing game. 	Human body puzzle, story flashcards, body part labels	Tracing Practice – क & ख	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Revise both letters orally with sound • Dotted worksheet tracing for क and ख • Blackboard tracing demonstration by teacher • Children practice on slates • Match pictures with letter cards (क / ख) • Quick recall game: Teacher says word, children say letter 	Worksheets, blackboard, slates, picture cards
